ABOUT THIS PACK

The contents of this pack are by no means exhaustive, but will provide you with basic information needed for the trip.

DEFINITION OF MISSIONS

Missions can simply be defined as an organised effort for the propagation of the Christian faith which is in furtherance of our charitable objectives.

Other definitions which can be given are as follows:

- ‘Group of Church Workers’: A body of people sent by a church to another part of the country or to a foreign country to spread their faith or do medical and social work.
- ‘Church Work in the Community’: A campaign of religious work, often including community aid at home or abroad, carried out by a church.
- ‘Communication of Beliefs’: The vocation or work of a church or other religious organisation or of individuals in communicating their faith in a variety of ways to the wider community.

This trip whilst being a community initiative will incorporate many of the above definitions.

Our main focus and priority is to fulfil the Great Commission by proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through evangelism, church planting, discipline and church development.

The majority of this work shall take place outside of the local church in foreign lands.

SCRIPTURAL BASIS

We believe that the Word of God as contained in the Holy Scriptures is the foundation of our mission's ministry. The following represents some of the passages, which address the mandate for missions.

WHY MISSIONS?

The following Scriptures show us clearly why we should have an active missions ministry:

GOD DESIRES IT

1 Timothy 2:1-5 (KJV)

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, *and* giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and *for* all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this *is* good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For *there is* one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

As God's work force on earth, Christians should be dedicated to implementing His desires under His guidance through the Word, prayer and the Holy Spirit. Our goals should be aligned with God's to bring all men - from every people group - to a saving knowledge of Jesus.

JESUS COMMANDED IT

Matt 28:18-20 (KJV)

And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:
Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, *even* unto the end of the world. Amen.

After His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His eleven disciples in the mountains near Galilee, and instructed them with these verses of Scripture known throughout the Christian Church as the "Great Commission". We today are, by His grace, His

disciples; the Great Commission is our commission, and His power and authority is just as relevant now as it was in the early church. His promise to be with His disciples ‘*always*’ is still true for us today. He promises to be with His disciples to the end of the age as they reach others with the Gospel. Who is to be reached? Jesus says here that disciples must be made from “all nations” (or more precisely all “people groups”, regardless of political or geographical boundaries that typically define “nations”).

JESUS EMPOWERED IT

Acts 1:8 (KJV)

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

While this Scripture had its immediate fulfillment at the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we believe that all members of the body of Christ have received the Holy Spirit. It is this power that guarantees our ultimate success in carrying the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

As believers in Christ we have received the same Spirit of God today, we are to reach our own “Jerusalem and Judea”, (eg. The local cities and towns in which we live); our own “Samaria” (those geographically near us, as well as those who may be ‘different’ from us, and perhaps not liked by our society); and “the ends of the earth” (those who are separated from us by distance, custom, culture or language).

GOD HAS PROVIDED THE OPPORTUNITY

John 4:35 (KJV)

.....behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest.

More than two and a half billion people around the world have never heard the Gospel message! Yes the fields are ripe just as when Jesus showed His disciples the harvest

fields in Samaria, expecting them to reap where they had not sown; even among those whom they disliked (the Samaritans).

JESUS TIED MISSIONS TO THE SECOND COMING

Matt 24:14 (KJV)

And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come.

This Scripture tells us, the church of Christ, to do our assigned task before we can rest in the joy of His coming again.

Emphasis is placed on five key activities: prayer, financial and other support, sending/going, training and accountability. The scriptural basis for each is outlined briefly below.

PRAYER

1 Tim 2:1 (KJV)

I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, *and* giving of thanks, be made for all men;

This Scripture, in fuller text, was quoted above under “God desires it”. It clearly sets the priority of prayer in reaching the world for Christ”.

Luke 10:2 (KJV)

Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly *is* great, but the labourers *are* few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest.

Jesus charged His disciples to “pray” to the Lord of the Harvest to send out workers.

This prayer should often be upon our lips remembering that God is able to bring in an abundant spiritual harvest.

Col 4:2-4 (KJV)

Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving;

Withal praying also for us, that God would open unto us a door of utterance, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in bonds: That I may make it manifest, as I ought to speak.

Paul the great Missionary gives us explicit direction to pray for the success of our Missionaries. God, in answer to our prayers, opens the doors of human hearts as nothing else can.

SUPPORT

Matt 16:24-25 (KJV)

Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any *man* will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.

For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it.

“He must deny himself.” This statement, which is in such sharp contrast to today’s “Self First” attitude, is a distinct instruction to deny many of the pleasures the world has to offer us in order to support the ministries of Jesus’ church. We deny ourselves as we use our time, talents and wealth to spread the Gospel rather than for our own personal desires. The result is that we gain joy from doing Christ’s bidding. As we have already seen, missions is at the core of these ministries. Therefore we are challenged (1) to use our time to pray for missions, to encourage Missionaries, and to actively participate in missions; (2) to use our talents and spiritual gifts to serve Christ in His work; and (3) to give back to Him of our financial blessings to foster the purpose of His church.

Jesus’ cross was for our propitiation; our cross is for His propagation.

1 Corinthians 9:7,11-12 (KJV)

Who goeth a warfare any time at his own charges? ...If we have sown unto you spiritual things, *is it a great thing if we shall reap your carnal things?*

Nevertheless we have not used this power; but suffer all things, lest we should hinder the gospel of Christ.

1 Tim 5:18 (KJV)

For the scripture saith, Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treadeth out the corn. And, The labourer *is* worthy of his reward.

Paul in these Scriptures clearly establishes the right and need for financially supporting those devoted to preaching and teaching the Gospel. He also sets the example of not hindering the acceptance of the message by demanding support from the new converts, although he says it is his right. The fledgling converts and churches are not yet prepared to take on such support. Therefore, the sending churches need to suitably support mission work.

SENDING/GOING

Luke 10:3 (KJV)

Go your ways: behold, I send you forth as lambs among wolves.

After His instruction to pray to the Lord of the Harvest, Jesus gave the seventy-two this personal charge to go, which should serve as a challenge to every Christian. As He sent them, He also instructed them to preach and to heal the sick, reminding us that whenever the love of God is declared in the preaching of the Gospel, it should also be demonstrated in loving acts.

Romans 10:14-15 (KJV)

How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!

Once again, Paul sets forth in clear logic why we must send people to do missions work just as he was sent by the church at Antioch. Those who are lost cannot come to Christ unless someone goes to them to preach the message of salvation.

Eph 4:11-13 (KJV)

And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers;

For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

We are to exercise our gifts from God. The word apostle means '*the sent one*'.

Therefore, if we have been given gifts to instruct in the knowledge of God we are to go as called. We as the church are to send those whom God calls.

Acts 13:2 (KJV)

As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them.

Not only is the mission worker to be called, but the church is also called to send and support. Not all who express the desire are equipped to go. It should be entered into prayerfully and with full awareness of the spiritual, physical, emotional and financial implications.

TRAINING

Matt 10:5 (KJV)

These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them,

Jesus instructed His disciples before He sent them out for a field training exercise.

Paul trains young Timothy. Likewise, we have an obligation to see that those we send out are equipped to meet the obstacles they will face – spiritually, physically, culturally and emotionally. In Ephesians 4:12 (cited above under Sending/Going) we are told, “...Some [are given] to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God’s people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up...” God has given the means and we need to assess and provide to the best of our ability the training needs of our sent ones both before and after sending. Continued growth is critical to all Christians.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Acts 14:26-27 (KJV)

And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled.

And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles.

Just as Paul reported on his work to his sending church, we will ensure reports are given on the missions work undertaken.

TEAMS AND ROLES

As this trip is not related to the church funds, CCRW will not be responsible for the travel and maintenance of those who are participating in this community initiative.

Each person who attends will be responsible for their travel, insurance, accommodation and feeding and other spending whilst on the trip.

The purpose and definition of missions has already been explained. It is therefore important that anyone making a decision to travel fully understands what it involves.

CCRW will endeavour to provide information on hotels, flights and transportation, but will not be responsible for booking deposits, etc.

The COO will be the main person for this community initiative.

Their role shall be as follows:

- Co-ordinate Prayer Cover/ Times
- Allocate Tasks/Assignments
- Handle queries relating to the crusade/event
- To act as a contact in case of emergency for those travelling to Nigeria.
- To provide details of other personnel

Prior to travelling to Nigeria, CCRW will hold a briefing meeting to ensure all who are travelling:

- Understand the purpose of the trip
- Have received the briefing pack
- Have informed and have the agreement of next of kin
- Receive information about the programme, times, venue, etc
- Spend time in prayer before the event (Miss a Meal a Day)

- **Receive prayer points for the trip**

CHECKLIST AND USEFUL TIPS

PRAY

It is important you know you have been led to embark on this trip. Prayer should underpin all your activities before, during and after your travel. Being spiritually alert, sensitive and aware will ensure you remain focused on the work ahead.

This community initiative is not for those who have a 'holiday mentality'. You will definitely enjoy the rewards of serving God in this capacity, but you should never be ignorant of the devices of the enemy.

INFORM

Tell those who are your next of kin (where appropriate) of your desire to travel to Nigeria. Someone close to you should know where you are going and the name of this person should be made known to CCRW in case of an emergency.

CONSULT

Consult your doctor or immunisation clinic for the necessary inoculations and tablets required for the country you are travelling to.

RESEARCH

Research best prices for travel and accommodation. Whilst the mission co-ordinators will endeavour to provide a list of agents/hotels. You may be able to source cheaper alternatives.

CHECK

Check your passport is valid. Take photocopies of your passport and keep them safe.

CURRENCY

The best way to carry your money is (travellers' cheques or foreign currency) One British Pound is currently at 980 to Naira. Don't carry all your money and valuables with you.

OBTAIN

Obtain travel and Medical insurance and make sure you see your GP before you travel to ensure you have the necessary immunisation, jabs and or tablets. For a few extra pounds you can ensure you are covered.

VISA *(please refer to guidelines on separate page below)*

Obtain a visa if appropriate. If you require a visa, it is best if you allow sufficient time to obtain the visa as some embassies can have unusually long waiting periods. To obtain a visa for this trip, please allow two weeks. Please contact the COO at CCRW for a letter of invitation to support your visa application.

PACK

Pack sensible clothing and footwear. Being comfortable is the essence. Do not take too many things.

WRITE

Write on the outbound journey your destination on the luggage label NOT your home address.

WEATHER

The weather during the time of the trip will be warm and could be muggy, so pack appropriate clothing for comfort.

FEEDING

Daily lunch will be provided for volunteers and workers.

ENTRY VISA/FREE ZONE GUIDELINES

- a. Visit the Home page of Nigeria Immigration Portal
- b. Locate & click on the appropriate application form to start the process:
 - i. Entry Visa/Free zone Application Form
- c. Fill the Application form; check the '**I ACCEPT FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE INFORMATION PROVIDED IN THIS FORM**' check box.
- d. Click on 'Submit Application' button to view 'Applicant details page'
- e. Click on "Proceed to Online Payment"
- f. Click to select Payment Currency "Pay in Dollars" option then Click on 'Continue' button

For Payment Outside of Nigeria

- i. If you select a processing country other than Nigeria, your payment will be in US Dollars. You will be re-directed to an approved payment platform to complete your application and make your payment in US Dollars.
- g. Please take your visa payment receipts, passport and other documents to the Nigerian Embassy in your Country of abode on your slated interview date for your Visa.
- h. Please note that you can reschedule your interview date to the next available date by sending your Application id, Reference no and the proposed date to our support mail address nis-support@newworkssolution.com

Tourist / Visitor Visa:

- a. Passport valid for at least 6 months
- b. Completed visa application form
- c. Two recent passport size photographs
- d. A Letter of Invitation from a company/host in Nigeria accepting immigration responsibility
- e. Visitors/Tourists are required to show evidence of sufficient funds
- f. Nigeria Immigration Service Visa Payment Receipt and Visa Acknowledgement Receipt

CONSENT FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT

WHEREAS, I wish to be a member of the CCRW community initiative team which will be travelling to and staying in Ikorodu, Nigeria

WHEREAS, certain circumstances and situations may occur resulting in my need for medical/dental care and treatment, and further resulting in my inability to personally give consent for such care and treatment.

THEREFORE,

1. In consideration of permission to participate in said mission, , being of legal age, authorise the mission co-ordinators to act on my behalf should I be unable to do so and to consent to reasonable medical/dental care and treatment, including but not limited to diagnostics tests, x-ray examination, anaesthesia, surgery or other procedures which may be deemed necessary to my medical well being for the duration of this mission. I further authorise the physician/dentist to call in any necessary consultants to dispose of severed tissues.
2. This consent is given in advance of any specific diagnosis, treatment, surgery or hospital care required, but is given to provide authorisation and specific consent for medical/dental treatment or care on my behalf, in the event I am unable for any reason, to give such consent.
3. Any consent by the person named above or the person acting in his/her place, shall have the same force and effect as if I had personally given the consent.
